GENERAL INFORMATION

Awards are a key component in recognizing the outstanding contribution of individuals in a volunteer organization such as ours. In the following pages, you will find instructions and guidelines for nominating those individuals/areas deserving of the awards.

It should be noted that any registered patroller may submit an Award Nomination to the Awards Committee. The only exceptions to this are the Training Officer's Award and the Executive of the Year Award. The Training Officer Award is based on First Aid Marks for a first year patroller. The Executive of the Year is selected through secret ballot by members of the current executive.

The awards contained in this guide are for the areas serviced generally by Gatineau Zone patrollers. These areas are:

The Awards Committee shall consist of the Zone President, V.P. Training, V.P. Operations and any registered patroller the President may appoint. The Chairperson of the Awards Committee is appointed by the President and may be but does **not** have to be a member in good standing of Gatineau Zone.

All Nominations must be submitted on a Nomination Form to the Awards Chair Person or designate for each appropriate category. A copy of the Nomination Form is part of the current package and is also available through the Awards Committee Chair Person, the Zone President or Patrol Leaders.

GATINEAU ZONE CSPS ALUMNI AWARD

This award is donated by the Alumni of the Canadian Ski Patrol System, Gatineau Zone, was first awarded in 1992, and given to the Gatineau Zone patroller who has logged the most volunteer time during the ski patrolling season. It is not to be awarded to Patrol Leaders, members of the Executive or Paid Patrollers.

Each area should submit their candidate to the Awards Committee stating the number of days/nights volunteered together with the number of hours to which these days relate. A weekend day will count for eight and one-half hours (8.5) a night volunteer duty would be four and one-half hours (4.5).

The award will be given as a mathematical calculation of the patroller in the Zone who has given the most hours voluntarily to patrolling. Patrolling any area counts as long as the Patrol Leader recognizes the effort. The Awards Committee will take no vote; the highest number of hours will be the recipient.

In the case where patrollers are tied, there are two ways to break the tie. The sign-in sheets could be provided by the Patrol Leader and the calculation will be determined by the number of minutes between sign-in and sweep or the Awards Committee may make two awards.

While it is recognized that on-hill patrolling is not the only way patrollers and executives donate their time to the System, this award is intended to recognize our "raison d'être" which the Alumni believes was our original purpose - to provide safety and service on the ski hills we serve.

The winner will receive the Gatineau Zone CSPS Alumni Trophy and a keeper plaque.

For the System to recognize the important contributions in various functions over a period of at least ten years by a special member who has shown dedication beyond normal expectations to the System and in so doing:

- b) Demonstrate to the System at large the value the System places in such individuals.

PUBLIC RELATIONS AWARD

To recognize the efforts of an individual or group who has promoted the desired image of the Patrol to one of the publics it is interested in influencing. In carrying out this effort, the person or group has:

- a) Created public relations activity beyond the efforts expected of all members.

To recognize the achievements of a group of individuals who, in working together at a Divisional level as an executive body, deliver the National activities, directions and policy to zones within their jurisdiction and in so doing:

- b) Motivate zones to do likewise.
- c) Bring forth, among all patrollers, patrols and zones alike, the willingness to support National programs in an energetic and creative fashion.
